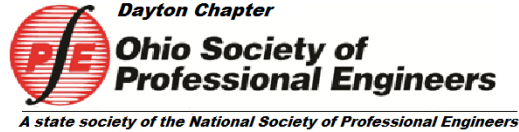

TEXAS PEs TO WORK IN SOUTH KOREA AND VICE VERSA

The Texas Board of Professional

Engineers and the Korean Professional Engineers Association have signed a Mutual Recognition Agreement to allow

Texas-licensed engineers to work in South Korea, and vice versa. This ground-breaking agreement was signed in March 2016, under the US-Korea Free Trade Agreement of 2012.

Texas Board of Professional Engineers continues to lead in the development of international licensure. Texas has also pursued



similar mutual agreements with Canada, Mexico, and Australia, as well as a Memorandum of Understanding with Japan.

ADVANCING AN ENGINEERING CAREER IN A NON-STEM WORLD

[This is the first of a series of articles designed to help engineers navigate through process of interviewing for a job.]

One of the services currently being provided is coaching and mentorship for current as well as emerging leaders, which is of great interest among government employees. While there is a plethora of interviewing books and videos addressing most variations of Google, Microsoft, and other major corporations' uniqueness when it comes to resumes and interviewing, the market is basically mute when it comes to interviewing techniques in support of the government sector. So, in the interest of leveling the playing field, we will be producing a series of short articles that will identify and describe the basic principles that guide government service interviewing

Rule #1: If you don't say it, it

does not count.

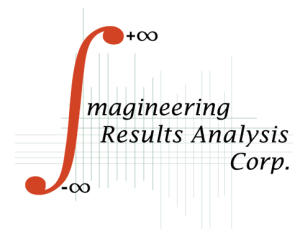
Explanation: It appears that this rule is universally misunderstood. Many job seekers believe that all they need to do is to capture their career highlights in the resume. The basic assumption is that the information does not have to be repeated in the interview (after all, it is in the resume). **WRONG!** The fallacy in the argument comes from a lack of understanding of the government interview process. Often, interviewing strategy is predicated on a "fairness principle". The main goal of this principle is to intentionally prevent a board member's influence in the selection board's interview process by providing "inside information" related to the accomplishments of one candidate (normally their favorite). Thus, when executed properly, the fairness principle mitigates the perception that popularity across the organization

will trump technical, managerial competence (unless you are a politician, but we are not talking about that concept here!).

Lesson: Include all relevant information in all your answers to the selection board, because, in government (and maybe in Industry), if you don't say it, it does not count!

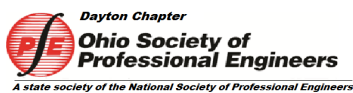
